NSS “Special Shram Sanskar” Camp was organized with the theme **Digital Literacy for Youth** during 16th to 22nd January 2025. This seven days National Service Scheme special annual camp was organized by NSS Department of JES College, Jalna at Saygaon, (Dongargaon) Taluka-Badnapur District, Jalna.

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Volunteers started their camp from college in two vehicles on January 16th, 2025 and reached camp venue i.e. Adarsh Vidyalaya Saygaon (Dongargaon) Taluka Badnapur District Jalna around evening. After arriving at the venue, the students cleaned rooms and school campus and made necessary arrangements for accommodation. Later at night, volunteers interact with held a village meeting at 8 pm to discuss and interact with the villagers.

Officially, **special camp was inaugurated on 17th January 2025 at 11 am.** On this occasion, chief guest was Shri Ayush Nopani, Police Commissioner, Jalna. The program was presided over by Dr. Mahavir Sadavarte, vice-principal, JES College, Jalna. Sarpanch of Saygaon (Dongargaon) Mrs. Chandrakalar, Deputy Sarpanch Mrs. Nirmala Gangaon, Progressive Farmer Mr. Natha Patil Gangaon, Deputy Education Officer Vipul Bhagwat, Mr. Shatrughan Barande, Mr. Narayan Rithe, Adarsh vidyalaya Head Master Shri. Pandharinath Unawane, NSS Program Officers, Prof. Rajesh Sarkate, Prof. Yogesh Lahamate, Prof. Kishor Kumar Tapdiya, Gram Sevika Miss. Kashi Wagh were present on the dais.

In inaugural speech, Honorable Additional Commissioner of Police Shri Ayush Nopani sir said that all tasks are the same and the students should not feel ashamed of doing them. Youth power can create vitality in the countries. He emphasized on the importance of “Shramdaan”. He said that many constructive works like roads, embankments, jogging tracks, village cleanliness, and pandan-free villages have already been done through Shramdaan. Shri Ayush Nopani also asserted that in current situation, only youth power can bring out positive changes in the countries.



Speaking as the chief guest on this occasion, Shri. Natha Patil Gangaon said that farmers should not turn to traditional agriculture but should cultivate orchards and become economically prosperous. He also said that dairy farming should be considered as a sideline business, which will help farmers overcome natural disasters and droughts.

While addressing the gathering, Vice-Principal Sadavarte Sir said that only the youth can bring about a revolution in the country through Shramdaan by gave the example of Rastra Sant Gadge Maharaj. Youth power is the power of the nation and it is essential for today's youth to know about it. The program was moderated by Prof. Rajendra Sonawane, while the program was prefaced by Prof. Rajesh Sarkate and lastly Prof. Kishor Kumar Tapdiya along with Prof. Yogesh Lahamate expressed their gratitude to the attendees.

In the after session on the same day, a **program on Women's Empowerment** was **organized**. On this occasion, Prof. Dr. Sujata Deore, on the topic of women's empowerment, urged women to become empowered and advised them to save money. She said that women are capable only if they are capable.



A cultural program was organized late in the evening. The students of the camp presented various talents on this occasion of Cultural program. Campers interacted with the public through various entertainment programs. On this occasion, the students entertained the audience by performing Nakla, Povade Laghunathika, folk songs and film songs, Bharud etc.



A health camp for free health check-up and blood test was organized for the villagers on Sunday, January 18th, 2025. During this time, doctor took blood samples from the campers and villagers. Also, complete information and guidance about blood donation was provided to everyone. A total of 40 people were tested for blood disorders this time. No anemia patient was found this time.

Saturday, 18th January, 2025, a lecture was organized on the topic of child labor and trafficking awareness lecture of Adv. Shailesh Deshmukh was organized. Adv Shailesh Deshmukh, while giving guidance as the keynote speaker, said that today, child labor and trafficking are an important issues in the society. He provided information on how to prevent child trafficking and how to prevent child labor. Adv. Devarao Dongre gave complete information about the laws on child labor and trafficking to the volunteers of the National Service Scheme. A large number of villagers were present at this program. This time, Dr. Yashwant Sonune was the chairman of the program, while the main attendees were Prof. Dr. Vilas Jadhav, Prof. Parashuram Chaure and Prof. Kishor Birkaylu was present.



At night, **Prabhakar Shastri Maharaj of Pavan Dham Ashram, Dongargaon, Taluka Badnapur, District Jalna** gave a lecture on importance of cleanliness. He also said that if the house is clean, the mind is clean then it generates clean thoughts. The villagers showed their presence in large numbers on this occasion. He added that “Service to mankind is service to God”.



On 18th January, 2025, **volunteers perform cleanliness drive in the village**. They clean roads, area around Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj statue. They removed grass and weeds around the statue. PO Yogesh Lahamate led the students for this activity, he himself participated in this cleaning drive. The villagers appreciated the volunteers cleaning work.



On the same day, **anti-child marriage rally was processed by volunteer**. They gave slogans spreading awareness about the socio-physical impact on children of child marriages. Volunteers explains the pros and cons of child marriages to the villagers and urged them not make marriages of their children in less age, instead they should make their children learn, get jobs and become successful on their lives.

On Sunday afternoon, January 19th, 2025 **a lecture** of Prof. Amol Khandebharad, Head, Department of Chemistry, JES College, Jalna was organized **on the topic of Food Security and Malnutrition**. He said that food adulteration is causing very bad impact on our health. Many of the day to day food items like milk, turmeric, chili powder, honey are adulterated using chemicals and other such materials. He also told few, very easy household methods of identification of these things. The program was presided over by Dr. Sushant Deshmukh, Head of the Physics Department of JES College. Dr. KG Khalifa, Dr. Varsha Zawar and Dr. Durga Mandhana were present on this occasion.



A lecture of Dr. Ganesh Kulkarni, In-charge, Skill Development Unit, JES College, Jalna on the topic of **Digital Literacy** was organized, Professor, Department of Botany, JES College, Jalna, on Monday afternoon, January 20, 2025. He explained how we should use the internet in this era, distinguishing between good use and bad use. This time, the program was chaired by Dr. Nanasaheb Gore. The chief guests on this occasion were Prof. Suryakant Chougule, Prof. Santosh Mundada, and Prof. Anil Ghatre.



A lecture of Ms. Shilpa Kawana was organized on **personality development**, in the late afternoon. On this occasion, she gave information about how students can develop themselves to face interviews and recruitment tests. On January 19th, a **team of volunteers presented anti child marriage street play** in the weekly village market. Though the street play, they spread awareness about the issues associated with child marriages. An appeal was made to all the villagers to avoid child marriages as well as report about such incidents to authority with the toll free number.





The camp participants prepared under Youth Engagement and Water Stewardship (YESW) program **two Soak-pits** in the village in Saygaon (Dongargaon). Team of 40 volunteers dug the two soak pits of size 20 x 10 X 4 ft. The soak pit was then filled with stones and sand in order to percolate the rain water deep into soil.



To explore the hidden talent present in the volunteers, a **“KavyaSandhya”, a poets' conference was organized** for the campers and villagers at Saygaon (Dongargaon) on 20th January evening. On this occasion, Prof. Dr. Phulchand Mohite, Dr. Babasaheb Wagh, Dr. Chandanshive, Prof. Shivaji Hinge, Dr. Babu Srirame, Prof. Babu Totare, Prof. Gajanan Bavaskar, Prof. Binnywale, Prof. Khandagale and the poets of the camp also presented quality poems one after another. Prof. Hemant Verma was the chairman of the poets' conference and won the applause of the audience by presenting Hindi poems.



A lecture on the topic of Environmental Change was organized by Dr. Umesh Mogle, Head of the Department of Botany, JES College, Jalna on Tuesday, January 21, 2024. The program was chaired by Dr. Vasant Pawar and the chief guests were Dr. Sunil Indurkar, Dr. Sanket Chobe, Prof. Umesh Mogle gave detailed information to the students on how to identify changes in the environment and how to take care of the environment.



In the afternoon session, a **lecture** was organized **on the topic of water management and its importance in life**. Prof. Dr. Laxmikant Shinde, Head of the Department of Zoology, JES College Jalna was the speaker. He gave detailed information to the students about why water management is needed today, why it should be done, its importance in life, and how water management can change our lives. On January 21st, 2025, a special program of **public demonstration for food adulteration** was conducted in village temple. In this program, NSS PO Mr. Kishore Tapdiya demonstrate household methods to identify the food adulteration in milk, turmeric, chili powder, honey. He practically shown villagers the ways to identify mixing of chemicals in the food items.



In line with the NSS special camp theme **“Digital Literacy for Youth”, an awareness program** for online transactions and frauds was conducted in the Hanumanji Temple of the village. In this program, volunteers explain various modus operandi used by schemers, hackers to cheat innocent peoples online. The volunteers display various slogans to make aware the people about Digital Literacy. Different posters were used to demonstrate how online frauds are implemented. Many villagers asked their queries about online cheating and volunteers responded them with possible solutions.

On last but one day of seven days special camp, **Bodh Sandhya was organized**. In this, review of all the activities and Shramdaan work at Saygaon (Dongargaon) was conducted. The volunteers shared their camp experiences in front of program officers and students. Many volunteers told that they were very happy and got very useful knowledge and confidence through this seven days camp. They got lifelong good memories from this camp.



On the concluding day morning, cleanliness drive and a rally was conducted in the village to spread the message of cleanliness in the village. Volunteers removes bushes and weeds and swept the Bus stand premises. They also clean the various chowks of the villages. Volunteers specially participated the maintenance work of the Pawandham Ashram Pradakshana Marg developed in the last year NSS special camp.



A competition My Clean House, Beautiful House was organized for the women villagers of Saygaon (Dongargaon) on Tuesday, January 21, 2025 at 12:30 pm. Women from the village participated in this competition by decorating their houses with beautiful Rangolis. A panel of judges visited every participant’s house for the evaluation and declared the results. JES College Jalna had announced and distributed cash prizes of Rs. 3,000 for the first place, Rs. 2,000 for the second place and Rs.1,000 for the third place.



The closing ceremony of the special Shramdaan camp was held on Wednesday, January 22nd, 2025. The program was presided over by Dr. Ganesh Agnihotri, Principal, JES College, Jalna. The chief guest for the function was Mr. Anant Kulkarni, the District Dy. Superintendent of Police Jalna. Speaking as the chief guest on this occasion, Shri. Ajay Bansal said that the National Service Scheme helps us in our all-round development. He guided the students to be prepared for competitive world. He also told that there no short cut for success and only your hard work can achieve your goals. On this occasion, Shri. Natha Shirang Ghanghav Progressive Farmer, Dongargaon, Miss. Mukta Shatrughan Parande, Sarpanch, Saygaon, Prof. Dr. Badrinath Ghonge, District Coordinator NSS Jalna were present on the dais.



Shri. Natha Patil Gangaon, in his speech, said that farmers should use modern techniques in farming.
